Dear Citizens,

Two public meetings were held on January 10th at the new Windsor Town Center to present information about the Juvenile Justice facility that is proposed to be located in Phase 3 of the Shirley T Holland Intermodal Park on Rt. 258. State and County officials presented information about the planned facility and answered questions from residents. The Economic Development Authority met on January 23rd and voted to return the 20 acres needed for the Juvenile Justice Facility to the County. A public hearing will be held by the Board of Supervisors on February 21st to receive comments on the proposed transfer of the property to the State. Action on the transfer of the land is expected to be on the Board's March 21st agenda. The Board of Supervisors will also discuss the project at their Work Session on February 7th.

The new E911 system is finally complete for all public safety agencies. The Sheriff's department, both Town Police departments, and Fire/EMS departments all began using the new system by January 15th. The old radio system has been taken down and is no longer being utilized. The 911 staff are also in the new Center and all indications are that the new system is performing extremely well. The next step will be to install the new radios in the School buses. I would like to thank all of our staff and volunteers for their patience and hard work in bringing this new radio system online.
